Q. 1 Jurisprudence help a person to understand the legal concepts, percepts and principles which are embodied in the legal system. Explain the significance and importance of jurisprudence.

OR

Q. 1 John Austin in his theory of law imparts the characteristic of absolutism and imperativeness to the sovereign. Discuss Austin's theory with special reference to the characteristic of the sovereign.

Q. 2 Han Kelsen's theory of law deals with the creation of hierarchy of norms, but excludes the creation of the grundnorm from his theory. Discuss Kelsen's theory of law with special reference to the grundnorm.

Q.2 Roscoe Pound has laid emphasis on the function of law in his theory and hence his theory is also called as the functional theory. Explain the functional theory of law and state its application to the Indian legal system.

Q. 3 Legislation is that source of law which consists in the declaration of legal rules made by a competent authority. Explain legislation as a source of law and also state its different kinds.

Q. 3 Rights are legally protected interest. Explain the concept of rights and also discuss the various kinds of rights.

Q. 4 Sometimes the law personifies a subject or an object and confers a legal personality on it. Discuss the legal personality of a corporation.

Q. 4 The concept of justice is the foundation of all legal systems even though the counters of justice may differ from time to time. Explain the concept of justice.

Q. 5 'A' finds a purse on the floor of the shop which is owned by the shopkeeper 'B'. Answer as to who should retain the possession of the purse 'A' or 'B'. Justify your answers according to the law of possession as has been stated in jurisprudence.

Q. 5 'A' has been defamed by 'B'. Advise 'A' about the liabilities along with the consequence, which can be imputed on 'B'. Justify your answers according to the principles of jurisprudence.
