- Q. 2 The basic principles underlying law of tort, is that no one should be harmed by the acts of others. Define torts and discuss the nature of torts.
- Q. 3 The state's liability for tortuous action has undergone a sea change. Explain the state's liability for torts with reference to the land mark cases.
- Q. 4 Actionable negligence consists in the neglect of the use of ordinary care or skill towards a person whom the defendant owes the duty to his person or property. Explain the components of negligence, with the help of *Donoghue v. Stevenson* (1932)
- Q. 5 A servant and independent contractor both are employed to do some work of the master, but there is a difference in the legal relationship shared by both with their masters. Explain the principles of vicarious liability of the master for the tortuous act committed by his independent contractor.
- Q. 6 The tort of defamation protect the reputation of a person, where as the defences available against an action of torts protect the freedom of speech and expression. Explain the defences available for the action of defamation as atort.
- Q. 7 A more stringent rule of strict liability than the rule in *Rylands v. Fletcher* was laid down by the Supreme court recently in the case of *M.C. Mehta v. Union of India* A.I.R. 1987 SC 965. Explain the principles of absolute liability as evolved in the case of *M.C. Mehta*.
- Q. 8 Explain the remedy of damages awarded by the court for an action of trots. So also explain the various types of damages.
- Q. 9 Discuss the procedure of making a complaint in the District Forum as prescribed under the Consumer protection Act.
- Q. 10 Discuss the object of compulsory insurance as a requirement under the Motor Vehicle Act.

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
