Let the Principal be responsible. The dictionary meaning of the word 'respondent' is 'let him answer', that is to say, let the person, against whom a relief is claimed, answer that he is not liable for the claim. Let the principal (or master) answer. This doctrine is usually applicable to actions ex delicto (torts) than to those founded on contract. The general rule is, that the principal or master is liable civilly (and, in some cases, criminally) for the frauds, torts, malfeasance and omissions of his agent or servant, when done in the course of his employment though not sanctioned, but even forbidden by the principal or master. The rule is based on let the superior answer for it, for he holds out his employee and competent and so warrants his fidelity, skill and good conduct in all matters within the scope of his employment. Another reason for this doctrine is the employer is more able to pay the damages than the employee.

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
