- Q.2** "Since the early days of the space era the international community has strongly endorsed the use of outer space for 'peaceful' purpose." Discuss
- Q.3** "Historical evolution of Military Uses of Outer Space and of Trends in Policy and Legal Responses to Space Militarization and Weaponization." Discuss.
- Q.4** "Continue increase in development of space infrastructure and an increasing number of states vying for the 'space-faring nation' status, the competing interests, both economic in terms of commercial exploitation and security in terms of strategic space assets and their use, are likely to become the bone of contention among states." Explain.
- Q.5** "Thoroughly and critically analyze the provisions of Article VI of the Outer Space Treaty, particularly from the perspective of its purpose, scope and divergence from general international law." Discuss.
- Q.6** "There have been several fundamental changes in the nature and scope of space activities as well as in the number and character of the international and national players in the space field. Therefore, the current international legal regime for space needs to be updated to remain effective and valid." Discuss.
- Q.7** Critically analyse the "non-appropriation" principle as incorporated in Article II of the 1967 Outer Space Treaty; i.e. "Outer Space, including the Moon and other celestial bodies, is not subject to national appropriation by claim of sovereignty, by any other means."
- Q.8** "Indian 'Space' Programme is a civilian initiative." Discuss.
