Q.1 Explain the concept of state as provided under Article 12 of the Constitution with reference to decided cases.

OR

Indian Constitution is federal at the time of peace and unitary in emergency. Explain the nature of Indian Constitution.

Q.2 “Equality is a dynamic concept with many aspects and dimensions and it cannot be imprisoned within traditional and doctrinaire limits.” Comment with landmark case laws.
