Burnout is used to describe a syndrome that goes beyond physical fatigue from overwork. Stress and emotional exhaustion are part of it, but the hallmark of burnout is the distancing that goes on in response to the overload. Burnout is a prolonged response to chronic emotional and interpersonal stressors on the job, and is defined by the three dimensions of exhaustion, cynicism and inefficacy. The past 25 years of research has established the complexity of the construct, and places the individual stress experience within a larger organizational context of people's relation to their work. Recently, the work on burnout has expanded internationally and has led to new conceptual models.

'Right' in the ordinary sense of the term, means a number of things, but it is generally taken to mean 'the standard of permitted action within a certain sphere. As a legal term, it means the 'Standard of permitted action by law'. Such permitted action of a person is known as his legal right. A legal right must be distinguished from a 'moral or natural right'. A legal right is an interest recognized and protected by a rule of legal justice- an interest the violation of which would be a legal wrong, done to him whose interest it is and respect for which is a legal duty. 'Moral' or 'natural right' means an interest recognized and protected by a rule of natural justice- an interest the violation of which would be a moral wrong and respect for which is a moral duty. The difference between the two lies in the sanctions behind them. The violation of legal right is redressed by the state whereas behind the moral rights there are only moral and social sanctions. If they are violated, it would cause only a social rebuke or disapprobation.

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
