Q1 a) Explain in detail the ratio held by the Supreme Court in *Ranjit Udessi v State of Maharashtra*.

b) Explain in detail the ratio held by the Supreme Court in *Virendra v State of Punjab*

Q2 a) 'The Indian Constitution not only promotes but also limits the freedom of press and media in the interest of justice' Justify the statement in the light of the limitations imposed on the media, by the Indian Constitution.

OR

b) Discuss the law of the contempt of court, and state the liability of the media in contempt proceedings.

Q3 a) Discuss the salient features of the Right to Information Act 2000, and state its role in promoting the democracy, by encouraging the culture of openness.

OR

b) Elaborate the concept of infringement of Copyright and the remedy available in case of Copyright infringement.

Q4 a) Discuss the role played by media during terror attacks at Taj, and state whether there is a need to have a legislation for a similar situation if arises in future.

OR

b) Write a note as to how the censor board faces a serious challenge from governments and from moral police, while discharging its functions.

Q5 a) One actress was asked whether females shall engage themselves in premarital sex, the actress answered the question in affirmative. One NGO was hurt by her answer and demanded her apology and a written promise that she will not make such statement again. The actress denied. The NGO went to court demanding action, on the grounds of decency and morality. Advise the actress with logical reasoning, and appropriate case laws.

b) One newspaper was critical of the policies of the state government. The state government banned the circulation of that newspaper. The newspaper challenged the ban as violative of Fundamental Rights. Discuss the possible outcome of the case with logical arguments and appropriate amendment to the Indian Constitution.
