Q.1 a) Explain 'State' as provided under Art. 12 of the Constitution with reference to decided cases.

OR

Q.1 b) Article 13 of the Indian Constitution defined law and also places limitation upon the exercise of Legislative Power by the Legislature. Discuss along with the doctrines.

Q.2 a) The concept of equality does not mean absolute equality among human beings which is physically not possible. Discuss the concept of equality embodied in Indian Constitution with the help of case law.

Q.2 b) 'The right to Freedom of speech and expression in Article 19(1)(a) includes the liberty of the press. This liberty has been held to be one of the great bulwarks of liberty and can never be restrained but by despotic Government.' Comment.

Q.3 a) The expression personal liberty includes the right to privacy. It can be curtailed or taken by following the fair and just procedure established by a valid law. Explain with the help of case law.

Q.3 b) The citizens of this country are free to profess, practice and propagate such religion, faith or belief as they choose. Explain the various Constitutional provisions relevant with freedom of religion.

Q.4 a) Fundamental rights and directive principles are supplementary and complementary to each other and fundamental rights are means to achieve the goal indicated in Part IV. Evaluate the relation between fundamental rights and directive principal of state policy.

Q.4 b) To cloth the fundamental rights with remedy, Article 32 guarantees the right to move the Supreme Court by appropriate proceedings. Comment.

Q.5 a) i) Write note on cultural and educational rights of Minorities.
ii) A religious association known as Anand Marg was performing Tandav dance in public place at Pune by carrying lethal weapons and human skulls. The District Collector directed the Police to prohibit such procession. The order of District Collector was challenged. Give your advice.

ii) National curriculum framework for school education 2000 which provided for education for value development based upon all religions and also a comparative study of philosophy of all religions was challenged on the ground that it was violative of Article 28 of the Constitution. Give your advice.
